As many of you know, the Boards of new Zealand and Australia have recently produced a Kingdom Policy on bullying and harassment. It is available at <http://sca.org.au/wp-content/uploads/2014/04/SCALtd-SCANZ-Policy-Pilot.pdf>

While how not to harass and bully people should be a matter of common sense, we encourage you all to read it. We hope you shall never have cause to need it. These are the kind of things are best discussed and set out before unpleasant things happen, so every knows what should be done when they do. Not a pleasant topic.

Southron Gaard has two events in the offing - Yule, and we possibly a Fimbulwinter. We warmly encourage you to attend if you can. Yule shall be celebrated in the northern city of Christchurch on 28 June, and the people of Dunedin are putting

together a plan for an event in the south, in late August.

Their group is not large, and they have very few experienced people. Putting on events can be a daunting task, even for those who have played a long time. It is not easy putting them on so far from help and the resources of a larger group. It is our wish to support their efforts. We hope to attend, and hope that you will consider going too. Seneschal's Comments

Greetings all,

Another month rolls past and they seem to be picking up steam! I'll give this job one thing – it sure isn't boring.

Firstly an update on some of the points from last month.

Online Council meetings. We tried again this month, but encountered similar connection problems. This seems to be pointing to an issue with the library wifi system automatically logging you out if it doesn't detect "normal" internet traffic. We're working with the library to see if anything can be done to address this. I have no intention of giving up on the goal of opening up council meetings online, and if necessary will consider moving the meeting to a venue that will allow this to happen. We're not at that point yet, but will keep this option open. I appreciate your patience on this.

Combined Practices. Contact has been made with a possible venue and we're just waiting to hear back on availability and cost. With any luck I'll be able to bring these details to the next council meeting. Further update next month.

Gear and Storage. I'm pleased to report we have a new quartermaster, Lord Raffé, who has graciously agreed to take on this role again. The role of quartermaster is not a glamorous one, nor is it one that can be largely managed by email as it tends to involve a bit of actual work. Big thanks to Raffé. One of the first projects will be to get some shelving into the Belfast storage container and organise what we have. Hopefully this will mean moving some stuff out that really belongs elsewhere.

Although the regalia project is gathering momentum as Baroness Isabel Maria takes on the Kingdom banner, I haven't had much further in the way of ideas for useful things for the Barony to purchase. Don't be shy if you have ideas on this matter.

Events. Already we have Yule and Collegium on the schedule for June and July. An event bid is

being discussed for something in August and another is bubbling away for November. It would be great to see us have an event of one shape or another basically every month, so get your thinking caps on. Even if you don't want to put a bid in yourself, if you have an idea for an event please feel free to discuss it with me as I'm happy to help find stewards or co-stewards to make ideas a reality. I would really like to hear from anyone that is considering bidding for Canterbury Faire 2015.

On other matters, by the time you read this I will have attended a fighter training weekend in Wildmoor over Anzac weekend along with Sir Philippe and Sir Callum. I'm sure many people will remember how hard it was in the early days of the Shire to get activities up and running, and how much it was appreciated when anyone from outside of the local area was able to visit to share their expertise. Hopefully with a little encouragement and support our people in Wildmoor will be able to start and sustain a fresh group of heavy fighters to bolster the Barony's numbers. I'm certainly looking forward to it.

Saidya Mahesti, our Reeve, has sadly had to leave our city to take up employment elsewhere. She will be still be fulfilling the role as reeve with assistance from local deputies, with a view to calling for a replacement later this year. I wish her all the best and hope she'll pay us plenty of visits.

In Their Excellencies' comments you'll read of the new kingdom policy on bullying and harassment. This is a topic that the landed Barons and Baronesses of the kingdom have been charged with taking a lead on, and it's important to sometimes bear in mind that even in a society that prides itself on honourable and chivalrous behaviour people occasionally choose not to maintain these standards. I say "choose" deliberately because the way we interact with others is always entirely our choice and we have no one to blame but ourselves if a loose word causes offense or hurt. While the policy on bullying and harassment largely deals with repeated unwelcome behaviour it's worth noting that even one ill-considered comment, particularly to a newcomer, can leave a lasting impression. Everyone has their bad moments from time to time and we shouldn't

have to tread on eggshells but do take some time to consider whether a comment is necessary or constructive before making it. Also, if you feel at any time that a line has been stepped over, point this out to the person concerned as calmly and constructively as you can. They may not have realised that a throw-away comment has caused offense, but allowing the behaviour to continue may mean it worsens to a point where it begins to affect group harmony and that's not pleasant for anyone.

In recent days we've made progress on disposing of the Baronial Trailer. It seems we have a buyer and the necessary administration has been taken care of. Many thanks to Lord Lowrens in

particular and Lords Angus and Raffe for handling this matter. The plan is to trial using a hire trailer on an as-needed basis for a while and then re-assess our needs at some point in the future.

Southron Gaard Council Meeting

Wednesday 9th April 2014

PRESENT: Richard (Richard), Isabel Maria (Miriam), Philippe (Peter), Raffe (Shaun), Darayush (Damon), Eva (Sarah), Maheshti (Agate), Ginevra (Beth), Agnes (Robyn), Philip (Robert)

APOLOGIES: : Elena (Niamh), Oswyn (Carl), Lucia (Betty), Lowrens (Scott)

MEETING OPENED: 7:30pm

PREVIOUS MINUTES: Passed unanimously.

OFFICER REPORTS:

B&B (Oswyn and Isabel Maria): Attended Baronial Anniversary. Correspondence with B&Bs in Lochac re bullying. Correspondence re BA awards and officer changes. Investigated fabric for new Baronial Gonfalon - nil progress. 3 trips to fabric stores of Chch have not shown any useable brocades for this project. I chose not to go with ACDC brocade.

SENESCHAL (Richard):

Received files from Lowrens. Discussed quartermaster position with Raffe. Announcement re policy on event proposals to FTT. 2 notices of welcome to new people that have taken out memberships. Request for loaner armour from Anton (Wildmoor) forwarded to Elena.

Discussion with Maheshti re moving to Auckland. Will stay on in Reeve position for now as most can be managed remotely. Will work with a deputy to manage anything here. Will start advertising for new reeve in the next few months.

Emails with Gheleyn (Wildmoor) regarding potluck they are likely to have in May. Advised that such events that don't require use of SCA insurance or financial support from the Barony are just private gatherings and don't need to go through council.

Emails with Gheleyn, Leonhart, Anton and others re fighter training weekend in Wildmoor. Have arranged for Anzac weekend. Currently Philippe, Callum and myself attending from Chch.

Email from Paul Larkin (Harrington Breweries) regarding renovation of Harringtons Riccarton and invitation to make it our new club "home". Thanked him, am passing this along, but advised we aren't really looking for one. Didn't think it worth enquiring if they had large tables and sewing machines.

Email from Leonhart (Wildmoor) re newcomer concerns. Discussed and passed along to Philippe. Passed on bits relating to armouring to Vitale and Sigurd.

Correspondence from Amalie regarding bad debtors policy. Responded that my understanding was that we would keep records of those that are consistently bad payers and that she should make whatever stipulations she deemed appropriate.

Discussion noted that we may not keep an official list of bad payers, but we should pay attention and inform stewards so they can make suitable arrangements. Richard to draft a formal policy and put it out for discussion so that it can be finalized and published on the website.

Have had seneschal email address redirected successfully and updated regnum. Sorted out online bank access (thanks to Lowrens and Maheshti).

Storage - Storage organisation seems particularly bad at the moment. Stuff in the lockup that I don't think should be there (eg lost property) and generally hard to know what's in various boxes. Also requires a lot of shuffling to find things. Suggest making cheap shelves for storage container and purchasing cheap stackable cubes for smaller items and labelling them clearly. Warehouse occasionally has these on sale for \$5 each.

Discussed shelving working bee. Aim for the weekend of 10th/11th May.

Accepted Raffe's application to be quartermaster.

Haven't sent account application to Smiths Hire yet. Just need to liase with registrar I think regarding company address.

Combined Practices – Waiting on contact with Papanui High. Will advise. Need to talk to Maximillian re A&S.

Attended Baronial Anniversary. Great event and feast. Disappointed with turnout for heavy and rapier championships. Discussed with a few people reasons that might have lead to that. Provided minor assistance to get stuff to event (mostly handled by Lowrens and Agnes).

Discussion with Gheleyn at BA regarding Fimbulwinter in Wildmoor. Like the ideas. Gheleyn to arrange a proposal.

Recieved expression of interest from Myrun re running a Golden Flight-like event in November. Myrun asked for suggestions for a Chch-based co-steward. Have contacted one person who agreed and so have put them in touch so they can start working on an event proposal.

Canterbury Faire 2015 – now accepting bids.

Baronial Anniversary 2015 – now accepting bids.

Kingdom conducting a survey on the way it communicates with populace.

Announcement from Kingdom Seneschal regarding rumour/concern that complaints not being investigated. No current complaints to investigate.

Need all officer quarterly reports by 15th April so that I can prepare mine.

REEVE (Mahasti): We are mid paying for BA site paid for feast and other things not completely.

Balances are currently:

The yearly audit paperwork has been sent away and we should look great. Thanks to all those who helped.

As I am leaving Southron Gaard I have been looking into a replacement and ways to continue to hold the post until a replacement can be found. Discussion with Richard, Ginevra and Oswyn re staying on as reeve. Moving to Auckland on 17th April.

We are endeavoring to add Ginevra to the list of signatories for the bank account. Chasing Nick (Sigurd?) in order to process a reimbursement. Sorted out internet banking access for Richard.

HERALD (Lucia): Attended Baronial Anniversary and conducted the opening court (thank you to Sir

Callum for conducting closing court!). Have received one expression of interest to become my successor when I step down later this year. No other reports received this month to date from my deputies, so will assume all is quiet.

ARTS AND SCIENCES (Maximilian)(report received after Council) I've been investigating venues for A&S. Haven't got one firm yet. I'll have updates for people shortly. I think I'd like to try the venue that's been found in the next month and will happily pay from own pocket taking donations towards it. If successful would like to continue.

CHRONICLER (Eva): FTT out on 2nd April. Have plans for new (agony aunt) column this month. Went to BA for a short spell and shot in archery tourney. Otherwise quiet.

WEBWRIGHT (Ginevra): Correspondence with: New officers re email pointing, regnum entries, and populace page blurbs. Others re populace & marshal page. Updated all of those pages accordingly. Still working through the link checking and related updates, and monitoring the various mailing lists.

CHATELAINE (Philippe): No demos this month. Arms and Militaria coming up in June. Correspondence from Leonhart in Wildmoor re broken links on website, treatment of newcomers, loaner armour and visit to Dunedin on Anzac weekend, and awards. Working on plan of action to make sure newcomers feel welcome.
