

Seneschal's Comments

Greetings unto the populace and Their Excellencies,

In the wake of a fine Canterbury Faire I have a troubling event to relate. At said event, a carload of 5 ruffians drove up to the Mong, and were asked to leave, it being a private event. After asking insistently to see peoples' swords, a request which was declined, they drove off toward the water hole. Thev then returned to the car park. The lady who had asked them to leave had at that time gone to the car park to leave via the lower gate. The boguns drove up next to her, and then behind her car so she couldn't get it out, variously exposing themselves and offering a volume considerable threats of violence, abuse and sexual assault, threatening to come back later if necessary do to so.

As much as this may just be the boguns' idea of a joke, it was upsetting and disturbing to the lady: she did not feel safe in the carpark, or trying to get her car out.

What is also somewhat dismaying is that no one came to investigate the prolonged shouting and abuse, despite having heard it. Some people claimed not to have heard it, but ladies well beyond their tents said they heard the shouting. A gentleman sitting in the Mong, within earshot

and sight of what had happened, said to the lady as she was walking back from the carpark to find a steward, 'You're from Canterbury, you should be used to it.'

She went to inform the Seneschal. to suggest someone ring the police. The then Seneschal thought it best to get the site manager to do it, but they were not on site. In the courteous waiting for his return, the police, in the end, were not called at all until the next day.

Eventually the boguns left, returning later to offer similar offence, albeit in smaller numbers, to another lady. It is possible they returned after this sortie, and it is believed they presented a firearm.

Upshot of discussion of this matter at Council brought these modest resolutions. If you are threatened, or think someone else is being threatened, you shouldn't have to wait round to find the site manager to call the cops. By all means, tell the site manager, steward and Seneschal, and remain accessible so the police know who called in the first instance. But anyone should be able to make that call, if they feel it necessary for the safety of themselves or any other person.

Also: to the gentlemen of the kingdom, yea, even the ladies. If you hear someone shouting nasty abuse, do alert someone who can go, or go and have a look yourself. The presence of another witness may deter even quite mouthy boguns from being a pest.

Do go and look - even if the lady being shouted at isn't your friend or of your political party. I'm sure that people out there wouldn't like even people they dislike being subject to and threatening obscene abuse. Don't just shrug and say, 'You're from Canterbury, you should be used to it'. See it as a chance to demonstrate the chivalry which is the glory of prowess and the arts and whatnot. Check to see if the person who has been so mistreated is ok. Get them a glass of water. If no one else already has done so, offer to call the cops. They might be a bit stressed, even if they don't realise it at the time, and not think ofit.

The Admiralty

Lord Anton de Stoc

Your very good excellencies of Southron Gard,


May I before any other matter give my good wishes to yourselves and your households in these times of trouble and disorder.

Given the recent advancement of that well-known ship captain Martuccio to the office of Admiral, it occoured to me that it may be a good and useful thing for Their Excellencies to understand what is commonly met by that title.

The word 'Admiral' perhaps having hidden depths or perhaps shoals, I therefore took the liberty of consulting a copy of John Rastell's fine work 'Difficult and Obscure Wordes and Terms of the Lawes of this Realme', and its definition thereof is copied below.

"Admirall is an officer under the Queene that hath aucthoritie upon the sea onely, to see the navie repaired maintained, to suppresse and chase away robbers, and rovers and to deale in matters between party, and partie concerning thynges done there, and for that purpose hath his court called the Admirality: yet he may cause his Citation to be seved uppon the lande, and take the parties body, or goods, in execution upon the land. And also he hath cognisace of the death or mayhem of man committed in any great ship fleeting in great rivers in the land beneath the bridges of y same next to the sea, also to arrest ships in the great streames for the vyages of the Queene and Realme, and hath iurisdiction in the said streames during the same viages.

If you would bridle the said Admiral, ensure that good and true men are appointed to his Admirality, or at least those who are appointed have pensions from yourself that are paid regularily. Document which ships are, and are not, great ships, and what of the various rivers, streams, waterways and estuaries that make up your lands are in fact 'great streames'. Do not under any circumstances allow him to begin games of chance on ships, for if this is done then his Admirality has regulation of them."

MEETING OPENED: 7.21

LAST MEETING'S MINUTES: Accepted

OFFICER REPORTS:

SENESCHAL (Oswyn): Corrrespondence with K&D Seneschals, various officers and members of the populace regarding quarterly reports and the barony's present finances. Am putting together a microbooklet for officers, including their reporting Also, correspondence from and with obligations. Anton de Stoc on the same head. Discussions with the Webwright regarding the Baronial OP. As I understand it, a page is retained for baronial awards, but for kingdom awards, a link will that you to the Kingdom canon lore site. Discussions with TEs regarding directions for the Barony. In summary, we need more small scale events which will make money for the barony, as well as give a feeling of continuing activity outside Crown events and practices. Question: our barony is larger than it used to be in terms of population (subscribing members), yet we have fewer events. Why is this? Correspondence with the owners of the present hall. We are possibly a month in arrears in terms of hireage, they don't know. This will be our last Council meeting here, I believe. Have been looking at alternatives.

CHATELAINE (Chunegund acting): I received back all the garb that I handed out, I must check on other pieces to see if they've been returned. Bought thread and needles for garb maintenance and will hopefully hand remaining monies to Reeve tonight. Contacted Meliekko of St Kessog about the possibility of newcomers coming from Dunedin to BA. I also gave Glenn my contact details for the costuming page and received an email from Antonia about the Chatelaine address. Talked to Raffe and Dauid about tracking down the flier formats for a reprint as these are getting low.

REEVE (Ginevra):

CF 09 Fighters Auction, for sending first-timers to CF is down to \$166. Permission was sought from Council to release this to general funds, and was granted.

HERALD (Callum): No report

MARSHAL (Raffe): Lots going on at practice, good numbers turning up and also interest from possible new fighters. Loaner gear (entire outfit) being worked on to fit new fighter and should see it on the field very soon. Assistance given to new fighter. Discussion and quizzing on Marshals handbook resume at practice. Assistance given to quartermaster to sort out baronial trailer and storage. Discussion with Seneschal on possible replacement venue if we can no longer use Riccarton Hall

CAPTAIN OF RAPIER (Ginevra): Practices continue on Tuesdays and Sundays. In case of venue changes, please check the mailing lists. I need to step down, due to health issues. Applications to myself and Oswyn please. There is a job description on the website, and I will be happy to answer any questions.

CAPTAIN OF ARCHERS (Darius): Correspondence this month with Kingdom Archery Marshal, and Thorald re heraldic stuff and sorting potential award names, and Raffe to see if the heavies would like to do a mixed practice. (They wouldn't). The Baronial Archery award is all set to go, with the exception of a confirmed name. As it stands, it will be the Order of Saint Sebastian. Most archers that I talked to are very happy to have it in place. There are 4 archers to receive the first awards at BA if their Excellencies will allow. Otherwise, all is well, practices continue to happen with one newcomer to the line and a regular appearance of a crossbow again. As this is my last report, all I have to say is that it has been a pleasure.

LISTS (Emilio): At CF I trialled the use of pre-printed list trees, which as an idea worked well and made the list simple to run. Unfortunately, the forms I was using turned out not to be the best for SCA tournaments so I

am looking for better ones. I like the double elimination trees on the Lochac list page, but didn't use them because there is only a limited selection. Are there more available? I'd like to print off a bunch so that almost anyone can run a list. I'm thinking about adding to the cardboard 'archive box' the list info currently lives in with a light wooden one (or maybe a small chest). The Archive box is just used for storage, so I'd like to make something that can be taken to events to hold list trees, paperweights, pens and pencils and which will resist the elements. I discussed at council a few months ago an idea to make a list tree and set of list shields for every authorised fighter in the barony to encourage a bit of pageantry. The idea was received positively so this is a project I'm going to work on this year. Finally, I'd like to train more people to run lists but there doesn't seem to be much interest. I'll work on this.

A&S (Mathilde): Much correspondence with Kingdom and Amalie about changeover. I will be stepping down at BA. Stuff night next week is undecided. We need 2 more entries to for the A&S comp to make it a competition, please get in touch before March 14th if you want to enter.

CHRONICLER (Elisabetta): FTT uploaded to Baronial Website with reminder to lists on 28 Feb 10. Sent to subscribers on the same date.

WEBWRIGHT (Antonia): Lots of the website has been overhauled this month. It should be much easier to keep the site updated now. Thanks to Isabel Maria who helped. More will be done after April, after the BA feast.

QUARTERMASTER (Angus): This month has been a relatively quiet month for me as quartermaster. I have completed the repair to the trailer and have got the WOF done.

Business Arising:

Wish to discuss a more business like format for officer reports

We require an overview of each Baronial Office which should include an aggressive strategic plan for the coming 12 months (how are things progressing, what can be done better, pro-active problem solving etc). This should be 500-1500 words, and is due at April Council.

EVENT REPORTS/UPDATES:

CANTERBURY FAIRE 2010 (Ginevra, Sybilla, Dauid): Discussion postponed till financial report comes in. Dauid made handouts of things he felt went particularly well, or particularly badly, which were to be looked over by the populace.

BARONIAL ANNIVERSARY 2010 (Angus and Elisabetta): Bookings are coming in, as are payments. A statement of financial position based on current numbers was presented, and greeted with relief as we are now making a profit! YAY!

TOURNAMENT OF ROSES 2010 (Richard): The Anzac Weekend tournament is intended to be a heavy-combat tournament that will be of interest to heavy fighters and observers alike. It will not be a long event, with probably no longer than 4 hours required. Rather than focusing on a specific medieval event or theme, the intention is to celebrate the SCA and the history of Southron Gaard, as well as providing a setting for pageantry and chivalry to be displayed. Richard's Provisional Bid was Accepted.

TAI TAPU FAIRE: As we have had 1 fighter, 2 archers and 2 dancers only volunteer, we decided to decline the offer, as it was felt we could not do a proper job.

Discussion followed on what it would take to do a proper, professional, slick demo, with Christopher outlining his plan for a Demo Team. This will be discussed further at the Strategic Planning Meeting.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

STRATEGIC PLANNING MEETING: Raffe to host at Showbiz. Further details to be advised via the lists.

CRESCENTS OFFICER: Alexandra de Santiago volunteered to take over this office. This was accepted, despite the lack of a Kingdom Officer, as it was thought to be useful at a Baronial level

HALL: Attendees were given a 2 page document with several options for replacement halls. People are to look over these at their leisure and advance their opinions at next council meeting. This will be held at Showbiz, as we will not be able to use this hall after the end of this month.

OTHER BUSINESS:

CLAY OVEN: The Clay oven is nearly complete.

REFUNDS: A lady has requested a CF refund, as she did not attend the full event. Council decided that she could have a refund of unused site fees as she was not merely injured but a lady of greater years and that we pay that on a per capita basis. As she never cancelled her meal plan, she should pay for that, and the parts of the event she did attend. There is a NO REFUND policy for if you cancel AFTER the cut-off date for bookings.

HARRASMENT POLICY: In case of harassment at events, it should not be left to the victim alone to call the police, but the responsibility of all attendees who are aware of the situation to ask if the victim wishes it done, or to do it if the threat persists. Site owners/

Managers should be informed, but this is a secondary consideration to getting a timely and rapid response from emergency services. During animated discussion, it was decided that Stewards should provide a phone station for the use of all attendees in case of emergency. Near the phone (whether cell or landline) there needs to be an information sheet, with relevant phone numbers (Police, Fire, Ambulance etc.) and location details, such as address and relevant navigation points. The location of this should be somewhere easily accessible, and public.

MEETING CLOSED: 8.55pm

Seneschal's addendum: meeting attendees are courteously reminded that if items are not submitted to the Seneschal for inclusion in the agenda before Council, or are introduced upon or after the closure of the meeting has been closed, the meeting may not necessarily be extended to include their discussion.

Also, the strategy documents specified by TEs above are no longer required.


